Cari E. Guittard, a noted dynamic speaker, will open the summit's sessions with a keynote address on "Geopolitical Perspectives – 5 Global Trends Americans Can't Afford to Ignore." Cari is a senior associate at Global Strategic Partners, a boutique intelligence, defense and strategic communications firm.



Luis Doménech of Mexico City provides an insider's answers on how Albuquerque businesses can increase their markets in Mexico and Latin America. He runs his own business, works under contracts with the states of Oklahoma and Colorado. He holds an MBA and has worked as an accountant for Ernst and Young.



Carol Grabauskas, Deputy Director of the Office of International Visitors in the Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs, U.S. Department of State, will let participants know what the government plans in bringing foreign, future leaders to the U.S. She will share information about how Albuquerque fits into the program.
